Subject: 2012 Annexation Initiative

City Council Members,

As you probably know, the Mayor has recommended annexation of lands in the attached map. He desires to have your support and participation in the endeavor and process. To that end, we are drafting the following meeting process for public input and feedback.

Please let us know your availability for these dates below. Any other feedback is most welcome as well.

River Oaks – Monday, March 19th 7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. Vinton Woods Clubhouse
Weston Woods – Tuesday, March 20th 7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. Ivy Tech Corporate Learning Center 823 Park East Blvd
Apartment/Business Owners – Wednesday, March 21st 7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. Ivy Tech Corporate Learning Center 823 Park East Blvd

The process for the public meetings for Weston Woods and apartment/business owners will be to present a general overview of annexation and the city with Tony addressing the attendees with his vision for the area and the community. Council members will be given an opportunity to speak if desired as well. HJ Umbaugh will help with tax analysis and attend as a presenter at all public meetings.

We will have tables or stations with each department (much like the trail master plan meeting that was held in the Holiday Inn) and citizens can go to the table/stations of their choice. They will be one for each department (some might be combined) but each station will have its department head and/or staff to answer questions and have printed materials pertaining to the annexation and their department and services. Mayor and city council will have their own table as well. Legal will be floaters for particular questions we can't answer that require legal advice.

We will also have some printed materials that will have the annexation process, timeline, maps, tax info, city services with a preamble from the Mayor and Council available for everyone.

This process will allow us to meet with constituents in a more effective and efficient manner while achieving greater input but avoiding a few that may monopolize the meeting for single issues.

A meeting notice will be send to all parties on March 6th. On this date the Mayor will meet with local media to formally announce the annexation initiative. Some department heads may be called upon to attend.

Though there is a high chance that this will be an involuntary annexation process, we will send out petitions for voluntary annexation after the public meetings are held.

The first reading of the ordinance will be held at the May Council meeting. If needed, additional meetings will be held between this set of public meeting and the first reading of the ordinance.
