McAllister Recreation Center closes fitness facility, remains open for extended Spring Break Camp

LAFAYETTE, INDIANA - March 16, 2020 - In response to concerns regarding COVID-19/novel coronavirus, Lafayette Parks and Recreation has announced that it will close McAllister Recreation Center effective immediately. The center will remain open for its extended Spring Break Camp through Friday, April 3. The closure is expected to last through Sunday, April 5, at which time, Lafayette Parks and Recreation will re-evaluate and respond accordingly.

Lafayette Parks and Recreation will continue to monitor this rapidly changing situation and follow the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention employer response recommendations for McAllister Recreation Center as well as all public facilities.

The City of Lafayette and Lafayette Parks and Recreation are committed to the health and well-being of Lafayette residents and continue to work hard to maintain clean, safe environments for all citizens of Lafayette.
