Lafayette Parks & Recreation seeks input for five-year masterplan

LAFAYETTE, IN – June 6, 2023 – Lafayette Parks & Recreation is seeking input from the Greater Lafayette community as preparations are underway for the department's new five-year masterplan. Community members are asked to fill out a brief online survey to provide feedback and input that will help shape the department's plans for the future.

The [survey](#), which can be accessed on Lafayette Parks & Recreation's website, will give the public a chance to weigh in with their thoughts and suggestions concerning facilities, programming, and park amenities. The deadline to submit feedback is Sunday, June 18.

"We want to hear from our community," said Parks Superintendent Claudine Laufman. "This survey is really critical for us to hear the community's opinions about the things they like, things they would like to see improved, and new things they would like to see in the future. We value that input so much."

According to Laufman, the information obtained through the brief 13-question survey will help the department determine what its goals and priorities should be moving forward. The plan will guide the implementation of activities until 2028.

"We are proud to have accomplished so much over the last five years; from the new Loeb Stadium, Memorial Island renovations, the new penguin exhibit at Columbian Park Zoo, new slides at Tropicanoe Cove, to system-wide playground replacements and upgrades, which are still ongoing. We've worked hard to meet our goals over the last five years, and we can't wait to see what the next five years will have in store for us."
