### **Area of Lafayette Under a Boil Water Order Advisory**

*Area is Elston Road east to Old US 231, south to Teal Road, west to Old Romney Road, back north to Elston Road.*

**LAFAYETTE, INDIANA – June 6, 2024** – Due to an emergency repair and out of an abundance of caution, homes and businesses in a specific part of the city are under a 24-hour Boil Water Order Advisory until further notice. The perimeter area in affect is: Elston Road east to Old US 231; south to Teal Road; west to Old Romney Road; back north to Elston Road. See the attached map of the pink highlighted area under the Boil Water Order for clarification.

The Boil Water Order is due to a disruption in water flow, and people will need to take the following precautions for the next 24 hours:

- 1 Boil water vigorously for three minutes prior to use. Use only boiled water for drinking, brushing teeth, diluting fruit juices, and all other food preparations or consumption. Use of bottled water may be a feasibility, though relatively expensive alternative to boiling tap water under a boil water order.
- 2 Do not use ice from a household automatic icemaker or use any ice made with un-boiled water from this system. Remake ice cubes with water that has been boiled or buy ice.
- 3 LET BOILED WATER COOL SUFFICIENTLY BEFORE DRINKING.
