Area in Rolling Hills Subdivision Under a Mandatory Boil Water Order, Starting on Monday, August 5!

LAFAYETTE, INDIANA – August 1, 2024 – Lafayette Water Works will be conducting repairs in the Rolling Hills Subdivision on Monday, August 5, affecting residents that live on Brazos Circle, Brazos Court, and Brazos Trail. Repairs include replacing a watch valve on the neighborhood hydrant that includes turning off water to the residents. Out of an abundance of caution, homes in that area will be under a 24-hour mandatory Boil Water Order once the water is turned back on. See the attached map of the area under the Boil Water Order for clarification.

The Boil Water Order is due to a disruption in water flow, and people will need to take the following precautions once the water is back on for the next 24 hours:

- 1 Boil water vigorously for three minutes prior to use. Use only boiled water for drinking, brushing teeth, diluting fruit juices, and all other food preparations or consumption. Use of bottled water may be a feasibility, though relatively expensive alternative to boiling tap water under a boil water order.
- 2 Do not use ice from a household automatic icemaker or use any ice made with un-boiled water from this system. Remake ice cubes with water that has been boiled or buy ice.



3 LET BOILED WATER COOL SUFFICIENTLY BEFORE DRINKING.

Water used for handwashing or bathing does not generally need to be boiled. Supervision of children is necessary while bathing or using backyard pools, so water is not ingested. If you have further questions, please contact Steve Moore, Water Works Superintendent, at 765-491-9378.
