LAFAYETTE, IN – March 25, 2024 – McAllister Recreation Center has announced a brand-new monthly bus day trip program. The **“Daycation”** bus trips will be once a month to locations based on the seasons and events around the Midwestern area.

Our “Daycation” trips are as follows:

- Wednesday, April 17 “Daycation” is to the Museum of Science and Industry in Chicago, Illinois, registration is \$120 per person.
- Thursday, May 9 “Daycation” venture will be to Holland, Michigan for the Annual Tulip Festival, registration is \$140 per person.
- Thursday, June 20 “Daycation” will be to Beef and Boards Dinner Theatre in Indianapolis, Indiana to see the Wizard of Oz, registration is \$120 per person.

All “Daycation” bus trips includes deluxe motorcoach transportation, admission, and a meal or meal voucher.

“We’re excited to offer the community a new opportunity to explore places outside of Lafayette that some may not be able to access on their own,” said McAllister Recreation Center’s Manager, Chad Aldridge. “This is a very special addition to our offerings at McAllister Center and we can’t wait to grow this program as the years progress.”

Registration is now open to the public for the first three “Daycation” bus trips online at LafayetteParks.org. “Daycation” bus trips are confirmed with full payment and are non-refundable. You must be 18 or older to register for the trips. Check-in will be at McAllister Recreation Center at 2351 N. 20 Street Lafayette, IN 47904. Some trips may involve considerable amounts of walking, but all trips and stops are handicap accessible.
