All Daycation trips include deluxe motorcoach transportation and admission. Registration fees vary per trip.

Registration is now open online for all four bus trips at lafayetteparks.org. Daycation bus trips are confirmed with full payment and are non-refundable. Participants must be 18 years of age or older to register for the trips. Check-in for all trips will be at McAllister Recreation Center at 2351 N. 20 St Lafayette, IN 47904. Some trips may involve considerable amounts of walking, but all trips and stops are handicap accessible.
